- **The Top Ten Consumer Scams:** This presentation provides an overview of the “Top 10” most common consumer scams reported to the Attorney General’s Office in 2007. It is designed to help consumers to protect themselves from becoming victims. - **Loan Fraud: Red Flags** This presentation discusses the tactics used by predatory lenders and what to be aware of, as well what your rights are as a consumer.
- **Financial Exploitation of the Elderly ( Summary):** This presentation describes current scams that are specifically hitting our elderly population. These scams can be done by family and caregivers but also by complete strangers via the telephone, e-mail and United States mail.
- **Methamphetamine: The basics:** This presentation describes what the drug Methamphetamine is and how it affects the human body as well as what law enforcement is doing to help curb its use and the other criminal activity that is often associated with its use.
