Poster Category Rules:

- Poster submissions should include the "Why Should I Care About Elder Abuse?"
 message with an illustration.
- Use only original artwork for illustrations.
- Crayons, markers, paint and pencil are acceptable for creating contest entries.
- Posters must be on 8 ½ x 11 unlined paper.
- Must print your first and last name on the back of your artwork submission

All Entries – Rules and Information

- Arizona junior high school students are eligible to enter.
- An Entry Form must be attached to each contest entry
- All entries must be received by 5 p.m. on May 2, 2014.
- Winners will be announced in May 2014.
- The winning artists will have the opportunity to appear in promotional activities, including press conferences and interviews.
- The winning artwork will be incorporated into a full-sized poster for use in a statewide Elder Abuse Awareness campaign.
