The main difference is that zwbk and gaia logs just tell about one event at a time, while sessions blob together a whole day of activity for what I've been calling a "cookieperson". You know, for a Zwieback cookie which is like a person but just one device, or for a Gaia cookie which is like a person who can use multiple devices.

There's a pretty good table in this slide that covers retention, format, location and some of the contents.
