Since the Trump Administration took office in January 2025, Attorney General Mayes has been fighting to protect the rights, services, and funding that Arizonans depend on. To date, the Office has joined 35 lawsuits against the Trump Administration. Some of those lawsuits challenged executive orders ending birthright citizenship and freezing billions in federal funding. In others, AG Mayes led coalitions of states to block President Trump's illegal tariffs and to protect Arizona's growing clean energy sector.
