- Arizona 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are eligible to enter.
- Poster submissions should include the NOT EVEN ONCE® message with an illustration.
- Use only original artwork for illustrations.
- Crayons, markers, paint and pencil are acceptable for creating contest entries.
- Posters must be on 8 ½ x 11 unlined paper.
- An Entry Form must be attached to each poster entry.
- All entries must be received by **5 p.m.** on **January 29, 2010**. Entries must be post marked or received to the Arizona Attorney General's Office. Electronic entries will not be accepted. Send unfolded poster entries to:
