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Post Conviction Notice—Lower Jurisdiction Courts

In the December 2020 Victims' Rights Brief "Revisiting Practices" we touched on the victim opting in for pre-conviction notice. In this edition, we will be reviewing the responsibilities of the prosecuting agencies, lower jurisdiction courts, and the victim as it relates to the Post-Conviction Notification Request (PCNR) form in misdemeanor cases.

Requirements Related to Post-Conviction in Lower Jurisdiction Courts

Prosecuting Agencies

ARS 13-4411. Notice of post conviction review and appellate proceedings

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- ♦ Complete section "A" on the PCNR form prior to providing the form to the victim.
- For all sentences, provide the victim with a form that allows the victim to request post-conviction notice from the prosecutor, jail, and the courts for unsupervised probation.
- Advise the victim how the completed request form may be filed with the appropriate agencies.
- Immediately notify the victim of the proceedings and any decisions that arise out of the proceedings including appeals, set aside requests, and motions to seal records.

Note: Even if the sentence is time served and does not include jail or probation, a form should be provided to the victim with a copy to the prosecutor's office in the event of a set aside request, appeal, and/or a motion to seal records.

- Complete section "B" on the PCNR form.
- Return a completed copy of the PCNR to the agencies listed on the form.
- Keep address and telephone number current with each agency.

ARS 13-4415. Notice of probation modification, termination or revocation disposition matters; notice of arrest

When the sentencing result is Unsupervised Probation and/or Jail

- Establish and maintain a system for the receipt of victim requests for notice. [A.R.S. § 13-4417]
- Notify the victim of the following proceedings: probation revocation disposition proceeding or any proceeding in which the court is asked to terminate probation; any hearing on a proposed modification of the terms of probation.
- Notify the victim of the following actions: any proposed modification to any term of probation if the modification affects restitution or incarceration status or the defendant's contact with or the safety of the victim
- Inform the victim of the right to be heard at a hearing set to consider any modification to any term of probation.
- Inform the victim that a petition to revoke probation alleging that the defendant absconded from probation has been filed with the court.

Ongoing Efforts with PCNR and PANR Forms

While there is nothing new in the victims' rights statutes with regard to responsibilities concerning Post-Conviction Notification Request (PCNR) and Post-Adjudication Notification Request (PANR), this area continues to be shrouded in confusion, mainly for the victims. Because of this, the Office of Victim Services has made it one of their missions to affect an increased awareness by delving into post-conviction notice in the Outreach and Education's *Basic Victims' Rights* and *Unraveling the Ambiguities of Post-Conviction for Victims of Crime* presentations. Additionally, the Victims' Rights Advisory Committee (VRAC) PCNR workgroup partnered with the AZ Bar Foundation to develop a video explaining the PCNR and PANR process that can be shared with victims.
