PROGRAMS



Online Safety: Grades K-12

Students in grades K-6 will receive an introduction to cyber predators, social media safety, and the consequences of cyber-bullying. 7th - 12th graders will receive additional information on sexting and the importance of protecting their privacy. Additionally, legal and social consequences are discussed.



Anti-Bullying: Grades 4-12

Addresses the different types of bullying, how it's affecting our youth, and preventative measures students can take. We encourage students to change the culture of bullying and find ways to create a kindness culture instead. We also inform students about the legal consequences of bullying and how it can affect their future.



Human Trafficking: Grades 7-12

This presentation discusses the crime of human trafficking, how traffickers find their victims, and steps teens can take to protect themselves. We also provide real life examples of human trafficking in Arizona and explain what you should do if you suspect someone may be a victim of human trafficking. **Content is age appropriate.



E-Cigarette Awareness: Grades 7-12

This topic will focus on educating students about the common myths and perceptions surrounding vaping and the use of e-cigarettes. Coordinators will provide information on the evolution of e-cigarettes and the dangers associated with the devices and the chemicals people are inhaling when using them.



Suicide Prevention: Grades 7-12

This presentation focuses on talking directly with teens about the suicide epidemic. We provide information on what you can do if someone talks about ending their life, signs to look for, and questions to ask. We will also give tips on how you can help, as well as how teens can get help for themselves.



Opioid Awareness & Prevention: Grades 7-12

This presentation focuses on the opioid epidemic plaguing Arizona. We discuss numerous topics relating to how opioids can negatively affect students. Placing heavy focus on prevalence, prevention, and support.



Young Consumers: Grades 11-12

Addresses how young adults can be safe consumers and avoid becoming victims of scams and identity theft. We provide an overview on how to safely apply for credit cards, car loans, student loans, as well as first-time car buying tips.
