Re: Arizona Fiber Optic Infrastructure Investment

Dear Mr. McManis:

I write to confirm CenturyLink's (n/k/a Lumen Technologies) commitment to invest in fiber optic infrastructure in locations throughout Arizona. Pursuant to the Consent Judgment entered on March 12, 2020, CenturyLink is required to invest, within 24 months of March 12, 2020, \$2 million in fiber optic infrastructure across Arizona that were decided upon in coordination with the Attorney General's Office ("AGO").

In selecting the locations, Attorney General Brnovich sought investments that will benefit law enforcement, small businesses, and consumers in underserved rural areas. Accordingly, the AGO would like to move forward with the following prioritized projects:¹
