Re: State v. Crotts; Grabinski; Friend; and Hoover, CR#2001-006183

This case is pending before Judge Kenneth L. Fields, who is located at Maricopa County Superior Court, East Court Building, 4th Floor, 101 West Jefferson, Phoenix, Arizona 85003.

At the April 27, 2005 status conference, the Court advised counsel that the August 3, 2005 trial date needed to be reset based upon scheduling issues with the Court's calendar. The trial is now scheduled to begin on **September 14, 2005 at 9:00 a.m.** in Judge Fields' courtroom.

An oral argument and status conference is scheduled for **May 17, 2005 to begin at 9:00 a.m.** before Judge Fields in the same courtroom mentioned above. Approximately 20 motions filed by the State and the defense will be argued at that conference.

A trial management conference is scheduled for **July 26, 2005 at 8:45 a.m. and July 27, 2005 at 8:45 a.m.** before the Judge Fields in the same courtroom mentioned above. At that conference, the State and the defense will argue evidentiary motions.

You are not required to attend any of these court proceedings unless you are subpoenaed, however, you have the lawful right to be present if you so desire. Please be advised it is common for court proceedings to be delayed or rescheduled for various reasons. If you plan to attend, you may want to call the Maricopa County Superior Court at (602) 506-8575 in advance to verify that the court proceedings have not been continued.

If your testimony is necessary at the trial, you will be subpoenaed by the Assistant Attorney General. A subpoena is a court order which requires you to be available to testify from the time and date on your subpoena, until such time as you are specifically excused.

It is possible that plea negotiations may begin at any time before the trial date. If this happens, we will notify you of the plea negotiations and of the rights you are entitled to regarding plea negotiations.
