Life Care Planning: This presentation talks about all the legal forms that someone should have in order to prepare for any life changing events that may take place unexpectedly. We also provide the public with Life Care Planning Packets free of charge. These packets include the Medical and Mental Powers of Attorney and Advance / Health Directives.

Consumer Scams: In this presentation we talk about the most recent scams and what the red flags are. We also talk about common scams and how the scammers operate. In addition, we provide the public with our Top Consumer scams publication, which is designed to inform consumers about the scams and what they need to do to avoid becoming a victim.

Identity Theft: This presentation addresses what Identity Theft is and what citizens can do to prevent becoming a victim. It also instructs what to do in the event someone does have their identity stolen. We also provide the public with our Identify Theft Publication free of charge.

TASA (Taskforce Against Senior Abuse): This taskforce was started to protect Arizona seniors from exploitation, abuse and neglect. The presentation goes over TASA's mission, common crimes against seniors, and prevention information.

Anti-Bullying for Parents: In this presentation we discuss some important information about bullying, the different types of bullying, the roles kids play in bullying situations, and red flags and information on what parents can do in these situations.
