Internet Safety & Substance Abuse Presentation Breakdown: Available for parents, teachers and students (K-12).

Internet Safety for K-3rd Grade: “Use Your Netsmarts” During this interactive video, the presenters go over how to be safe online and in real life by talking to kids about the rules that they need to follow to stay safe.

Internet Safety for 4th – 6th Grade **: In this power point presentation we talk about the internet and how Cyber-Predators use social networking to gain access to kids. We also cover Cyber-Bullying and talk to the students about how being a cyber-bully or a victim of cyber-bullying can affect the rest of your life.

Internet Safety for 7th – 12th Grade: In addition to Cyber-Predators and Cyber-Bullying. This presentation also addresses Sexting. Presenters discuss the dangers of these topics and the ramifications of what can happen if students engage in these types of activities.

Internet Safety for Parents: For parents, presenters will teach about the potential threats that the Internet and Social Networking sites may bring to their children. We educate the parents about Cyber-Predators and how they operate. Also covered are Cyber-Bullying, Sexting. As part of the presentation presenters will hand out our Internet Safety Publication to provide the parents with further resources and literature on these matters.

Anti-Bullying for 4th-8th Grade: Addresses the different types of bullying, how it affecting our youth, and the preventative measures students can take against bullying. We provide real life examples of kids who have been involved in bullying and the roles each of them play.
